Message from Alcor CEO, Max More, PhD

As a member of Alcor, a Cryonics magazine subscriber, or someone who has expressed interest in cryonics, you probably already know quite a bit about cryopreservation. But research continues, with new breakthroughs being made and changes going on at all cryonics-related organizations. At the Suspended Animation conference in South Florida on May 20-22, 2011, I'll not only be speaking but also listening eagerly to the developments reported and enjoying the company of thought leaders, activists, and supporters of cryonics. I hope you'll join me there. As I just took over the helm at Alcor at the start of January, it would be good to meet as many people interested in cryonics who I don't already know. Alcor has worked closely with Suspended Animation, the organizer of the conference-a company in Boynton Beach, Florida where advanced human cryopreservation equipment and services are being developed. Besides our two organizations, speakers will come from Cryonics Institute, 21st Century Medicine, and Critical Care Research, and will include other individuals such as architect Stephen Valentine on the property upon which Timeship will be built and plans for the future. You will learn about advanced work on achieving reversible solid state suspended animation, improving whole-body vitrification, portable liquid ventilation systems, revival of cryopreserved humans, and wealth preservation strategies for revival. After your cryo-knowledge has been deepened and your imagination stirred by the presentations at the Hyatt Regency, you will be transported to SA's extraordinary laboratory where you will be able to see some of these technologies for yourself. Aside from learning about current research by pioneers including Dr. Steve Harris, Dr. Brian Wowk, Dr. Greg Fahy, and Dr. Ralph Merkle, and seeing S.A., this is a great and rare opportunity for getting together with others interested in cryonics.

NEW STATISTICS (As of December 31, 2010)

<u>Membership</u>

Alcor had 932 members on its Emergency Responsibility List. Seven memberships were approved during this month, 1 membership was reinstated, 2 memberships were cancelled and 1 member was cryopreserved. Overall, there was a net gain of 5 members this month.

Applicants

Alcor had 6 new applicants were added, 8 applicants were converted to members and no applicants were cancelled resulting in a net loss of 2 applicants for this month. Information Packets

Alcor received 206 info pack requests this month, 15 were handed out during facility tours or from special request. The average total of 199 info packs sent per month in 2010 is compared to 188 in 2009.
