

Training-Laughlin

As there has been a large turnover in employees at the Riverside Resort in Laughlin, Nevada over the past couple of years, their management requested a training session so that there will be adequate coverage in the event of an emergency. This was a full two-day event that included all aspects of the stabilization process from cryonics theory to practical application to an in-

house scenario that involves the entire hotel security team.

#### **Medical Response Director, Aaron Drake**

As a part of the required paramedic refresher training, <u>Aaron Drake</u> will be certified as a CPR, AED, First Aid, and Blood Borne Pathogens instructor. This will lead to all staff members having the opportunity to renew their CPR certification and review use the inhouse AED. This will be beneficial not only in the event of an employee medical emergency, but also for the general public and members who visit and/or tour the Alcor facility.

# READINESS AND TECHNICAL COORDINATOR

#### **Pod and Dewar News**

Pod Dzeus Fastenzer

With the recent arrival of our 3 new bigfoot dewars it was imperative that we construct the pod suites which fit inside. Twelve new standard size pods and three neuro center columns were produced by a local fabrication shop. These have now been fitted into the dry dewars for storage and are awaiting use. These new pods have been slightly redesigned for ease of construction, and all of the aluminum panels have been laser cut and computer numerical control ("cnc") punched/bent which has improved the fit and finish. The cnc programs are now finished and stored in the computer so in the future when more pods are needed, the production of new pods will be straightforward.

During the patient transfer procedure from cooldown into

long term storage the transport and readiness team make an effort to prepare the transfer as quickly as possible without compromising workers' safety. One area where it seemed the team could reduce time was during the fastening of the aluminum cover to the pod base. Steve

Graber wanted to work out a more streamlined method of attaching the pod covers so he specified a quick lock ¼ turn spring loaded Dzus fastener to replace the rather tedious threaded screw with captured nut. The Dzus fastener is pre-attached to both the pod base and the cover and he expects that these will reduce the time spent on fastening the cover during our transfer procedure.

In the team's final report regarding the boiloff performance of our 3 CryoFab Dewars, Mike Perry recently confirmed that BF16, the 3rd Cryofab dewar is averaging below 10 liter/day boiloff. Mike writes, "I fitted the boiloff data for Bigfoot 16 over a 240-day baseline using a polynomial (7th degree). The curve for depth of LN2 in inches vs time was straightforward piecewise-linear and nearly smooth at the viewing scale. I've assumed that an inch-thick layer of liquid is 20.593 liters in volume. The boiloff rate, shown as a function of time and also of depth of liquid in the dewar is about 10 L/day initially, falling sharply then more gradually to about 7.5 L/day then increasing somewhat near the end of the observation period".

#### New Data Acquisition System - Refractometer Calibration Rig

Accurate refractive index readings are critical in our perfusion plan during cryopreservation procedures. Refractometers are highly sensitive to changes in temperature and although ours do have a basic built-in temperature compensation circuit, our desire is to have accurate refractive index readings in the range of +3C to -3C. Rather than calibrate our refractometers at room temperature and depend on the temperature compensation circuit to artificially adjust the values it makes much more sense to just calibrate the refractometers at or near the actual temperature values we see during cryopreservation.

The rig is comprised of a chiller, a heat exchanger, a small roller pump, a ½" tubing refractometer head adapter (for easy swapping of refractometers), a beaker containing calibration solutions, and several small lengths of clear tubing. The chiller operates

typically at 3C (although this value can be changed) and circulates a water/E.G. solution up through the heat exchanger. On the other side of the circuit a small roller pump draws our calibration solution (water/e.g.) up out of the beaker, through the heat exchanger, past the refractometer head and back down into the beaker. Various thermocouple probes track temperature at the chiller and pre-post the heat exchanger.

#### **O2 Sensor Replacement**

This month the O2 sensing unit in the Operating Room failed. While testing the sensor and then the unit it was determined that the main board in the housing had stopped working. A new Draeger Polytron 5000 replacement was ordered and arrived within the week. To ensure that safety in our surgical suite is not compromised Steve installed it as soon as possible after receiving it. The O2 sensing unit is a critical Draeger O2 sensor

our use of LN2 during cryopreservations. Our sensor is tied into an automatic ventilation system which operates if/when the sensing unit determines the O2 level has fallen below 20.1%. Typical atmospheric O2 level is 20.9%.

# ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

#### **Membership Statistics**

Alcor had 968 members on its Emergency Responsibility List. Two memberships were approved during the month of May, no memberships were reinstated, no members were transferred to associate member, one membership was cancelled. There were no members cryopreserved. Overall, there was a net gain of one member in May.

# **Applicant Statistics**

Alcor had 42 applicants for membership. Four new applicants were added, two applicants were converted to members and one applicant was cancelled resulting in no net gain in May.

#### **Associate Members**

Alcor had 9 associate members and no full members were transferred to associate member in May.

#### **Information Packet Statistics**

Alcor received 43 info pack requests in May. Fifteen were handed out during facility tours or from special requests. The average total of 85 info packs sent per month in 2012 compares to 104 in 2011. The full Information Packet is now available online.
