

Symposium on Cryonics and

Brain-Threatening Disorders

On Saturday, July 7, 2012, around 30 people attended the first ever symposium on dementia and cryonics in Portland, Oregon. Ben Best, who attended the event and was one of the presenters, provides a detailed account of the symposium about this important but discomforting topic. Also present was Alcor CEO Max More who spoke about the concept of the "extended mind" and its implications for personal survival and neurodegenerative diseases.

MEDICAL RESPONSE DIRECTOR REPORT

Case reports

During the month of September we have made positive strides in case report development.

Aaron and Ice Bath

- A-2478 was posted to Alcor's website.
- Suspended Animation has submitted reports on their involvement with the remote standby/stabilizations of A-1088 and A-2091.
- A-2091 has been completed and is only awaiting the inclusion of temperature and cryoprotection graphs.
- A-2357 is near completion and should be submitted soon.
- A-2628 has been started.

The plan is to complete case reports for the most recently cryopreserved patients first and then address those patients from previous years that occurred when we had higher than average numbers of cryopreservations.

Public Education / Media

Over the past month, we have conducted 5 tours with a total of 29 attendees.

A videotaped interview and tour were provided for a media company out of the UK.

TECHNICAL & READINESS COORDINATOR REPORT

Perfusate Mixing

Steve Graber mixed up an additional eighty liters of M22x1.25 perfusate this month, bringing our current total for M22x1.25 to 210 liters. He is planning to bring us up to 300 liters over the next few months and to do this the technical team is in the process of ordering more liquid chemicals to replenish the stock. Steve recently created 14 pre-weighed packs of dry chemicals for M22/B1 mixing, with each pack capable of creating 40 liters of either B1 washout or M22 perfusate.

For the most up-todate information throughout the month. Check the Alcor News Blog item that the team uses on every surgical case is the crackphone. The crackphone is a custom made miniature microphone capable of withstanding LN2 temperatures. This little device on the end of a long wire is used to listen for (and record) possible cracking events during the extended cooldown procedure. Alcor's most recent case brought the inventory level to just above minimum levels so Steve has been in the process of making more crackphones. The piezo microphone element is very small, so it takes a steady hand to solder the wires to both sides of these little round items.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

Membership Statistics

Alcor had a total of 975 members on its Emergency Responsibility List. Five memberships were approved during the month of September, no memberships were reinstated, one member was transferred to associate member, four memberships were cancelled. There were no members cryopreserved. Overall, there was no net gain or loss of members in September.

Applicant Statistics

Alcor had a total of 38 applicants for membership. Nine new applicants were added, five applicants were converted to members and one applicant was cancelled resulting in a net gain of three applicants in September.

Associate Members

Alcor had a total of 21 associate members in September.

Information Packet Statistics

Alcor received 75 info pack requests in September. Nine were handed out during facility tours or from special requests. The average total of 70 info packs sent per month in 2012 compares to 104 in 2011. The full Information Packet is now available online.
